Story of an Epicenter Partner in Mozambique

Fátima Filimone Cossa is 55 years old, married and mother of three sons. She lives in Zuza Village with her husband in the company of sons, spouse, grandchildren and daughters-in-law. She is a student in adult literacy in a class of 32 students (29 women and 3 men). Fatima shares with us her story of change.

«I am a farmer and I always practiced agriculture in up-land as an income generation mean.

The good thing that has happened in my life was the fact that my village had become part of an epicenter created by The Hunger Project-Mozambique. With the arrival of this project, I was able to become acquainted with the various programs implemented. The Literacy program appealed to me as I wished to go to school and I never had the opportunity to study.

I started studying in 2010. Now I am doing the second level, and I want to go to the very end. At the beginning it was difficult to understand but since I wanted to learn I forced myself the study. Yet I don't know how to read and write correctly all the words, but I believe that when you are on the third level I will learn to do correctly the readings and writing. However, now



at least I already write perfectly my name that before I could not and that makes me very happy.

Now I can already do some calculations, observe the service books of my grandchildren, things that before I could not do because there was no school. Now I am able to understand what my grandson wrote yesterday or today, because in school they write dates every day that

they have classes, and as I can already read the numbers easily, I can understand.

I am very sorry when I see young people who should be attending school, but simply are not, because going to school is very important. My great dream is to know how to speak correctly the Portuguese language, write and read. I would like that the majority of women and men of my age who did not study go to school to
